ANNUAL NOTIFICATION TO STUDENTS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) afford students certain rights with respect to their education records. They are:

(1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the College receives a request for access.

Students should submit to the registrar, dean, head of the academic department, or other appropriate official, written requests that identify the record(s) they wish to inspect. The College official will make arrangements for access and notify the student of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the College official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise the student of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.

(2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the student believes is inaccurate or misleading.

Students may ask the College to amend a record that they believe is inaccurate or misleading. They should write to the College official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record they want changed, and specify why it is inaccurate or misleading.

If the College decides not to amend the record as requested by the student, the College will notify the student of the decision and advise the student of his or her right to a hearing regarding the request for an amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the student when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3) The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

One exception which permits disclosure of records without consent is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the College in an administrative, supervisory, academic or research, or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the College has contracted (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent); a person serving on the Board of Trustees; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by Fort Peck Community College to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is:

Students Please Note the following amendment:

As of January 3, 2012, the U.S. Department of Education's FERPA regulations expand the circumstances under which your education records and personally identifiable information (PII) contained in such records — including your Social Security Number, grades, or other private information — may be accessed without your consent. First, the U.S. Comptroller General, the U.S. Attorney General, the U.S. Secretary of Education, or state and local education authorities ("Federal and State Authorities") may allow access to your records and PII without your consent to any third party designated by a Federal or State Authority to evaluate a federal- or state-supported education program. The evaluation may relate to any program that is "principally engaged in the provision of education," such as early childhood education and job training, as well as any program that is administered by an education agency or institution. Second, Federal and State Authorities may allow access to your education records and PII without your consent to researchers performing certain types of studies, in certain cases even when we object to or do not request such research. Federal and State Authorities must obtain certain use-restriction and data security promises from the entities that they authorize to receive your PII, but the Authorities need not maintain direct control over such entities. In addition, in connection with Statewide Longitudinal Data Systems, State Authorities may collect, compile, permanently retain, and share without your consent PII from your education records, and they may track your participation in education and other programs by linking such PII to other personal information about you that they obtain from other Federal or State data sources, including workforce development, unemployment insurance, child welfare, juvenile justice, military service, and migrant student records systems.



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Distance Learning and Online Classes

Fort Peck Community College online learning allows for students to take courses entirely online. Fort Peck Community College offers programs fully online, allowing students to interact with students across the United States.

Fort Peck Community College utilizes Canvas as the Learner Management System to deliver classes online. Online courses are classified into three categories: synchronous, asynchronous, and polysynchronous. Students will need a computer, web browser, and connection to the internet to take online courses.

Synchronous Learning (80, 81) happens in real-time. Synchronous learning brings the class together in a virtual classroom. Fort Peck Community College utilizes Zoom video conferencing to bring students together in a synchronous virtual classroom. Synchronous learning creates an environment t for real-time collaboration and discussion. This model also imitates an in-person classroom and **schedule course times are listed on the course schedule.**

Asynchronous Learning (90, 91) is a less structured environment, allowing students to complete their coursework online without the restriction of being in class at a specific time. Asynchronous learning allows more freedom to the students to manage their time and work schedules. Asynchronous learning at Fort Peck Community College provides student and instructor engagement, and feedback is still shared with the flexibility to the student. There will be no scheduled course times.

Polysynchronous learning (70, 71) incorporates learning opportunities with contemporary online learning technologies. At Fort Peck Community College, polysynchronous education is a blend of asynchronous and synchronous online learning. This learning model has been the preferred model of Fort Peck Community College, and the college is committed to every student's success. There will be scheduled course times. Students unable to participate the synchronous lessons will be allowed to view the recorded activity for continued participation in the course.

Online learning is new to Fort Peck Community College, and FPCC Is committed to provided quality education for students near and far. All courses listed on the schedule as Asynchronous will not have scheduled times for the class to meet. Synchronous or polsynchronous courses will have scheduled course times however, Students unable to participate the synchronous lessons will be allowed to view the recorded activity for continued participation in the course.
