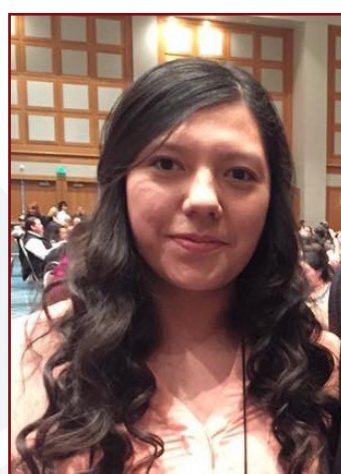




Student Profile
